

How to Use Three Critical Points for Remediation with Focused Review 2.0

The My ATI > IMPROVE tab contains your Focused Review 2.0 to complete after each Practice Assessment in the Content Mastery Series. Each Focused Review is built based on the results of your assessment and contains content areas for you to study that will help you increase your knowledge of that subject matter. This creates a personalized learning experience by assessing student learning gaps. The intent of the Three Critical Points Method is to help you identify the most important content to study and help organize your learning in a document for continued review.

Find the **Topics to Review** in your Individual Performance Profile. After each Major Content Area, the number of items to review will be listed. For Management of Care, 8 items need to be reviewed. Nursing Process: Priority Action to Take for a Client Who Refuses Treatment

1 **Hydrocolloid:** An occlusive dressing that swells in the presence of exudate; at the wound's surface to prevent evaporation of moisture from the skin.

- Maintains a granulating wound bed
- Can stay in place for 3 to 5 days

Hydrogel: Composition is mostly water. Gels after contact with exudate, pro Rehydrates and fills dead space. Might require a secondary occlusive dressi

- For infected, deep wounds or necrotic tissue
- Not for moderately to heavily draining wounds
- Provides a moist wound bed
- Soothing and can reduce wound pain
- Prevents skin breakdown in high-pressure areas (the sacrum)

Alginates: Nonadherent dressings that conform to the wound's shape and
