EXPERTS' TIPS FOR SUCCESS

FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE OF OTHERS WHO HAVE ALREADY SET UP SUCCESSFUL PARTNERSHIPS

DON'T HESITATE

- Schedule a meeting ASAP with nurse education leaders in your state.
- Include state hospital and healthcare associations.
- Communicate with nursing administrators across the state too.

USE EXISTING RESOURCES

Take advantage of communication templates already written by OADN and nursing leaders in Iowa who already successfully penned letters.



GARNER WIDE SUPPORT

- Make a statewide announcement if possible.
- Include nurse education leaders early.
- Talk with student nurse leaders too.
- Then share their enthusiasm with practice partners.

REQUEST EMERGENCY LICENSING & FOCUS ON STUDENTS GRADUATING SOONEST

Ask your state BON what steps are necessary and then

make sure students know exactly what to send in to receive their licenses.

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ADJUST TO PLACE STUDENTS ASAP

Consider how to fulfill practice-partners' needs, e.g., end final-semester coursework early to onboard new grads quickly & work with your registrar to run transcripts ahead of other university students.

DETERMINE HOW HOURS WILL CONVERT & COUNT THEM TOWARD ORIENTATION

Work with your BON to decide how students' participation in preceptorships will convert to clinical experience.

BE ACCOMMODATING BUT ...

Ease practice partners' needs wherever possible, such as supplying students' PPE. But keep students' needs in mind, too, such as asking for back-to-back clinicals.

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SHARE YOUR SUCCESS

Once you've experienced success, reach out to other providers. Explain that the pipeline is emptying & that new nurses may not be available when they need them without their participation.



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
